Marta Goertzen Armin (1923-2009)

In 1989, Marta Goertzen Armin, a former resident of SCOC, began to draw scenes from her childhood (1927-1937) on a settlement farm in southern Manitoba. She is a gifted artist who studied at the Brooklyn Museum School of Art in New York. Marta is shown above with one of her Quipu string paintings that are based on an ancient method of record keeping by the Incas. Her skills as a designer are evident from the logo which she created for SCOC.

Adele Armin will be presenting and discussing a selection of drawings created by her mother that delightfully illustrate many aspects of early rural Mennonite life.
